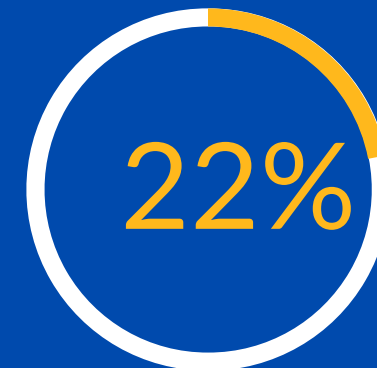


# Co-curricular Experience

# Co-curricular Experience

Undergraduate respondents reported the following being "Very Important" to "Essential" in their interactions with other students in student clubs/organizations:

Developing an ability to work with others to accomplish a goal
