
UC Undergraduate Experience Survey (UCUES)

UCUES is a systemwide biennial survey used to better understand the academic and co-curricular experiences of <u>undergraduate</u> students

• Graduate students are surveyed via the UC Graduate Student Experience Survey







"This campus values students' opinions"




"Overall, I feel comfortable with the climate for diversity and inclusiveness at this university"




Campus Safety

"Overall, I feel safe from crime and violence on campus."



"Students of my [group] are respected at this university"








Food Insecurity - Last 12 Months








Feelings About UCPD - Gender & Sexual Orientation

"How positively or negatively do you feel about the role of UC Police Department at UC Riverside (UCPD) for <u>campus safety and crime prevention</u>?"







"How positively or negatively do you feel about the role of UC Police Department at UC Riverside (UCPD) in responding to <u>student mental health emergency calls</u> on campus?"






"Which of the following Health, Well-being & Safety departments have you utilized since you enrolled at UCR? Check all that apply."




Satisfaction About Services Received From HWS

+ Very satisfied



Summary

- Overall, UCR students have more positive opinions of campus than students systemwide
 - Areas of concern: sexual misconduct and food insecurity

Campus Safety & UCPD:

- UCR students feel more safe on campus at UCR
- Students' feelings towards UCPD for crime prevention and mental health emergency calls were mostly neutral
 - Rates were more negative for some marginalized groups such as Black and LGBTQ+ students
- Utilization evaluations for UCPD were lower than other HWS departments, but the context for students to interact with these departments varies greatly
- HWS questions are a baseline and will be repeated to show improvement
